Chrysoula Dosiou, MD, MS is a Clinical Professor in the Division of Endocrinology at Stanford University School of Medicine and Medical Director of the Stanford Thyroid-Eye Clinic. She obtained her undergraduate degree from Harvard College, her medical degree from Harvard Medical School, her internal medicine residency training at University of California, San Francisco, and her fellowship training in Endocrinology and Metabolism with a Master of Science degree in Clinical Epidemiology at Stanford University. Since joining the faculty at Stanford, her clinical focus has been the care of patients with thyroid disease, with a special interest in the management of thyroid disease in pregnancy and the care of patients with thyroid-associated ophthalmopathy. Dr. Dosiou's research interests have been in the field of hormonal regulation of the immune system, the cost-effectiveness of screening pregnant women for thyroid disease, and the management of patients with thyroid eye disease. Dr. Dosiou served as Program Director of the Stanford Endocrinology Fellowship from 2014 to 2023. She is an active member of the American Thyroid Association and a member of its Thyroid and Pregnancy Guidelines Task Force.
